1. School Overview & Strategy

At Yorkswood Primary School, we are committed to using the Primary PE and Sport Premium to ensure that all pupils have access to high-quality PE, a wide range of physical activities, and opportunities to lead healthy lifestyles. Our strategy for this academic year focused on upskilling staff, increasing extra-curricular participation, and ensuring equitable access for SEND pupils, girls, and disadvantaged pupils.

Key Targeted Groups:

- **SEND Pupils:** We provided specialised coaches and targeted support for participation in extra-curricular opportunities.
- **Girls:** Focused on CPD for staff to support inclusive PE and increased access to extra-curricular sports.
- **Disadvantaged Pupils:** Removed financial barriers by providing before and after-school sports clubs free of charge for all pupils.

3. Impact Against Key Indicators

Indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

- **Action:** Provision of free-of-charge before and after-school clubs.
- **Impact:** Significant increase in pupil participation levels and engagement in regular physical activity.
- **Outcome:** Positive impact on daily physical activity levels for all cohorts.

Caption: Pupils engaging in our free-of-charge morning sports provision, ensuring a healthy start to the school day.

Indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

- **Action:** Investment in high-quality equipment and diverse extra-curricular offerings.
- **Impact:** PE and sport now have a higher profile within the school culture, contributing to positive PE attainment.

Caption: Our new sports equipment being used during break times to encourage active play.

Indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- **Action:** Allocated £2,779 towards internal staff learning and development.
- **Impact:** Positive impact on staff confidence and competence in delivering the PE curriculum effectively.

Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- **Action:** Specifically targeted girls and SEND pupils with bespoke opportunities and specialised coaching.
- **Impact:** A more equal and broader experience of sports across the whole school population.

Indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

- **Impact Note:** While current spending was prioritised towards participation and CPD (leading to "no recorded impact" in competitive growth this year), the foundation for

future competition has been strengthened through improved skill levels.

4. Swimming Data (Year 6 Cohort)

Meeting the National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety is a mandatory reporting element.

5. Sustainability and Next Steps

To ensure these improvements are sustainable, Yorkswood Primary School has focused heavily on **Staff CPD**. By investing £2,779 in internal learning and development, we have ensured that high-quality teaching remains in-house, even after the current funding cycle ends.

Next Steps for 2025/26:

1. Utilise the unspent £1,095 to further bolster the competitive sports programme.
2. Continue monitoring the impact of free extra-curricular clubs on disadvantaged pupils.
3. Target improvements in Year 6 swimming outcomes, specifically in stroke range and self-rescue.
